TASTING NOTES

Villa Le Prata Brunello di Montalcino 2013. This Brunello di Montalcino reveals a harmonious balance of power and elegance, shaped by high-altitude vineyards and traditional methods. There are layered aromas of ripe cherry, plum, and dried flowers, complemented by earthy undertones and a hint of spice from extended oak aging. The palate is full-bodied yet refined, with firm tannins, vibrant acidity, and a long, persistent finish that reflects its 36 months in large oak barrels and additional bottle maturation.
