





POUILLY-FUISSÉ 1ER CRU LES CRAYS



TASTING NOTES

Manciat Poncet Pouilly-Fuisse Premier Cru Les Crays 2023. From the very south of Burgundy, this vintage features grapes from vines over 50 years old, that are harvested manually followed by gentle pressing, followed by decanting for 24 hours. 75% of the fermentation occurs in oak barrels, whilst the other 25% is done in stainless steel on fine lees for 8 months. There is ripe citrus fruits and low to moderate acidity with chalky accents on the palate. Overall, a wine with good length and complexity.
